Feasts this week (No Feast This Week)

The Word: Rejoice He Is Near!

The opening antiphon of the mass today from the Letter of St. Paul to the Ephesians (4:4-5) says, "Rejoice in the Lord always; again, I say, rejoice. The Lord is near". The Advent period is when we look forward to the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. The period challenges us to undertake three primary activities, preparation, penance, and prayer, but this Sunday adds one more thing; rejoicing! Is there any distinction between joy and happiness? why do we have to rejoice instead of being happy? At this point, there would be a need for us to define happiness and joy. Both come with excitement but they differ from their sources, intensity, and durability. Happiness comes from something that is outside of the individual; or put in another way, the cause of one's happiness is always external. One can be excited when he gets a Christmas gift. Joy, on the other hand, is a facility that is within us; in other words, it is internal. While happiness could be strong, joy is stronger and more intense. Happiness builds on circumstances, which means, it could change when the circumstances that brought it change. Joy, on the other hand, is a divine orchestration, therefore, it comes out of "God-stance," not on any circumstance. St. Paul tells us that joy is a gift of the Holy Spirit (Galatians 5:26). Furthermore, happiness is by coincidence of chance, but joy is by a convinced choice in God. At the resurrection of Jesus Christ, we hear that the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord (John 20:20). Our Lord Jesus Christ tells us also that the excitement in heaven is out joy, for instance, when one sinner repents (Luke 15:7, 10). Therefore, on this day let us connect with our inner selves to feel the joy God has put in us and never allow nor permit any ugly circumstances of life you might be passing through at this material time to rob you of this internal joy.
